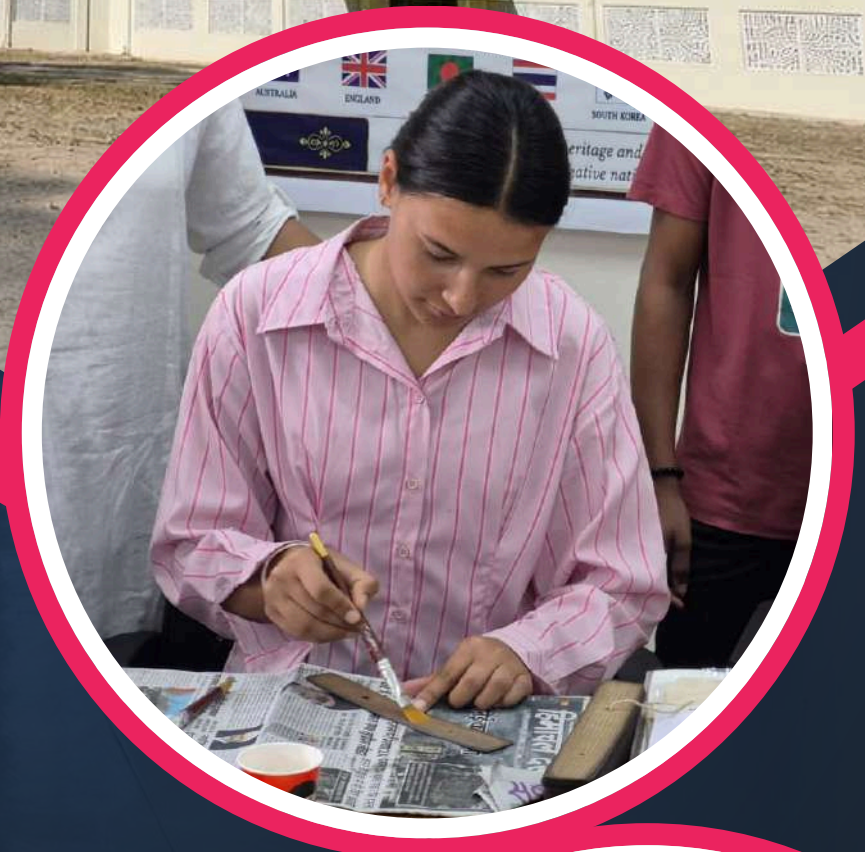

What could be more inspiring than receiving education in the peaceful surroundings of the Himalayas? Situated in Village Panarsa, often known as the gateway to the beautiful Kullu Valley, Government College Panarsa offers students a calm and motivating environment for learning and personal growth. Located on the right bank of the River Beas, the college lies 25 kilometres south of Kullu and 45 kilometres north of Mandi on NH-21, surrounded by orchards, pine forests, and majestic mountain ranges.

Established in 2015, the college was founded with the vision of making higher education accessible to students from the surrounding rural areas. What once began in temporary classrooms has now grown into a vibrant institution with its own campus. Since October 2025, the college has been functioning from its new campus, providing students with improved academic facilities and a more comfortable learning environment.

At present, the college offers undergraduate programmes in Arts and Commerce streams. The campus includes smart classrooms, a well-furnished library, a music room with musical instruments, and sports facilities that encourage students to actively participate in both academics and extracurricular activities. From the Desk of Principal

वे बनती हैं प्रतीक्षा से, विश्वास से और उस
अथक श्रम से जो अक्सर दिखाई नहीं देता।

प्रिय विद्यार्थियों, सम्मानित अभिभावकों एवं महाविद्यालय परिवार के सभी सदस्यों,
प्रणाम !

CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

- Ragging is strictly banned in the college. There shall be no ragging in and around the college.
- Ragging means any type of physical or mental torture, done by any individual or group, either by words or by conduct, which gives an apprehension in the mind of a person that he cannot pursue his studies free from any mental disturbance/torture created thereby.
- Following nefarious activities will be considered gross misconduct and can lead to fine or suspension/expulsion:
 - a. Writing obscenities/ dirty words on black boards, walls or furniture.
 - b. Aimlessly loitering in the corridors, raising noise or attempts to disturb classes.
 - c. Smoking or taking Drugs/Alcohol etc. in the campus.
 - d. Any attempt to damage the furniture or other property of the campus.
 - e. Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without Principal's permission.
 - f. Misbehaving with the college staff.
 - g. Using mobile phones in the class room and playing music on the cell phones in the campus.
 - h. Bringing outsiders, miscreants or anti social elements in the campus.
- Students who participate in sports or other extra-curricular activities/educational tours must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.
- Every student must carry with his/her identity card which is issued to him/her when he/she joins the college. He/she must produce the identity card whenever demanded.
- Parents/Guardians are requested to remain in touch with the college Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress of their wards.

The Government of Himachal Pradesh has implemented the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. In accordance with NEP 2020, the UGC has introduced a student-centric "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (UGC-CCFUGP 2022)". The Sardar Patel University, Mandi (H.P.) with effect from the academic session 2026-27 has also approved SPU-Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes in alignment with NEP 2020.

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 recognises that higher education plays a crucial role in promoting human and societal well-being, and in developing India as envisioned in its Constitution—a democratic, just, socially conscious, and humane nation that upholds liberty, equality, fraternity, and justice for all. The NEP 2020 notes, "given the 21st-century requirements, quality higher education must aim to develop good, thoughtful, well-rounded, and creative individuals."

The NEP 2020 states, "Assessments of educational approaches in undergraduate education that integrate the humanities and arts with Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) have consistently shown positive learning outcomes, including increased creativity and innovation, crucial thinking and higher-order thinking capacities, problem-solving abilities, teamwork, communication skills, more in-depth learning and mastery of curricula across fields, increases in social and moral awareness, etc., besides general engagement and enjoyment of learning."

Further, the NEP 2020 also recommends that "the undergraduate degree will be of either 3- or 4-year duration, with multiple exit options within this period, with appropriate certifications."

In accordance with the NEP 2020, the UGC has formulated a new student-centric "Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (UGC-CCFUGP 2022)" incorporating a flexible choice-based credit system, multidisciplinary approach, and multiple entry and exit options, which will facilitate students to pursue their career path by choosing the subject/field of their interest.

Based on the UGC-CCFUGP notified in December 2022, Sardar Patel University, Mandi (SPU) has developed a Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (SPU-CCFUGP, hereafter SPU-UGP), incorporating all essential aspects of the UGC CCFUGP to facilitate the achievement of the policy visions stated in the NEP 2020.

UG Degree Programmes:

The UGC-CCFUGP: 3.2.3 offers various undergraduate degree programmes for students to choose from. The different UG Degree programmes are:

1. UG Degree Programmes with Single Major
2. UG Degree Programmes with Double Major
3. Interdisciplinary Undergraduate Programmes
4. Multidisciplinary Undergraduate Programmes

Note:

- At the initial stage of implementation of NEP 2020, Government College Panarsa offers 3-year UG Programme degree options with Single Core Discipline (Major).
- The students shall declare their Major and Minor, finally, at the end of the second semester.

Programme Components:

Towards the attainment of holistic and multidisciplinary education, the College will offer courses from every Department before the commencement of each semester, listing the courses for Major, Minors, Discipline-Specific Electives, Multidisciplinary Studies, Ability Enhancement, Skill Enhancement, and Value Addition, along with the offering departments and course in-charges. This will enable students to select the courses of their choice. The students will then choose the courses of their choice from the list being offered, taking into account the requirements outlined in the curriculum of the degree they are pursuing.

The entire 3-year UG programme curriculum is divided into two parts: (a) Core Courses and (b) Common Courses, which are described below:

(a) Core Courses:

The core courses comprise Discipline-Specific Core, Discipline-Specific Elective (DSE), and Minor courses. All core courses have a credit allocation of 4. Altogether, irrespective of any significant or minor options, a student will necessarily need to study 23 courses with a total credit allocation of 92 over a 3-year programme. The degrees relevant to the core courses will be awarded.

1. **Major Courses:** Courses offered by a particular department for own students. The minimum credit requirement for a Single Core Discipline (Major) over 3 years is 64, which translates to 16 courses, including 5 DSEs.
2. **Minor Courses:** One of the Major courses offered by the Department shall be treated as a Minor for students of other departments. The department may also offer a separate course or repeat the same course(s) as a Minor for students of

other departments. The minimum credit requirement for a Minor Course over 3 years is 24, which translates to 6 courses.

(b) Common Courses

1. **Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC):** (Total Credits 9) Courses offered by a particular department shall be considered multidisciplinary for students of other departments. A student cannot opt for an MDC catering to their Core Courses (Major and Minor). The student should be motivated to opt for a different subject each semester.
2. **Ability Enhancement Course (AEC):** (Total Credits 8) Courses on Language and Communication Skills, viz. English, Hindi, and Sanskrit
3. **Skill Enhancement Course (SEC):** (Total Credits 9) The College will identify the Skill Enhancement Courses to be offered in a semester, and students will choose the skill course of his/her choice from the courses offered.
4. **I/A/P/C/ (or Work-based Vocational Course*):** (Total credits 4) Internship/ Apprenticeship/Minor Project/Community Outreach (I/A/P/C) or Work based Vocational Courses are courses common to all students and will be carried out during the winter and summer terms/vacations. Although offered in the second semester, students may be encouraged to make their choice at the end of the first semester, allowing them to carry out activities during winter vacation as well.
**This course will not be offered in the first (beginning) academic session.*
5. **Value-Addition Course (VAC):** (Total 6 Credits) These are the course(s) common to all students to be offered as a VAC category in a particular semester. The College will assign one or more teachers to teach these courses as required, regardless of the teacher's background or qualifications.

Duration for Award of UG Certificate, UG Diploma and Degree

The UG Programmes will be of 3-year duration with appropriate certifications and exits, such as:

- UG Certificate after completing 1 year (2 semesters) of study in the chosen fields of study with 44 credits, including four credits in I/A/P/C/ or work-based vocational course(s) offered during winter/or summer term.
- UG Diploma after 2 years (4 semesters) of study with 86 credits.
- 3-Year Bachelor's Degree after successful completion of three years (6 semesters) with 128 credits.
- Students will be permitted to take a break from the study during the period of study, but the total duration of completing the programme shall not exceed 7 years.

Note: It should be noted that any certificate/diploma/degree is awarded only if the student clears (i.e., passes) all the required courses (papers) up to that point in time.

Change of Programme

The students who wish to change programmes in the 2nd year (or third semester) shall be eligible only for the 3-year B.A. programme (Multidisciplinary), subject to availability of seats and the Major programme in the College and earning of additional credits (8 each in each of the two core Major disciplines). Two courses of any one discipline studied in the first two semesters will be treated as a Minor. The remaining 16 credits shall be earned from a single Minor discipline.

Multiple Exits and Entries

As permissible under UGC Guidelines for Multiple Entry and Exit in Academic Programmes offered in Higher Education Institutions, students will be allowed to enter/re-enter in the odd semesters and exit after even semesters, provided that they fulfil the minimum requirements for entry and exit.

For example, a student can exit a programme after one year and then re-enter the programme at a later time, continuing from where they left off. This process can be executed multiple times. However, entry into the programme is subject to the availability of positions at the institute/college at that time. However, an institution can increase the number of seats by ten per cent to accommodate students re-entering the programme or coming from a different institution. Besides, the following should apply:

- A student will receive a certificate/diploma/degree upon exiting the SPU-UGP (depending on the year of graduation), provided they have passed all the minimum compulsory courses at that point in time.
- After exiting, either at the end of Year 1 or Year 2, the student can seek entry only into the same program to which they were initially admitted.
- When a student exits the SPU-UGP after 3 years with a Bachelor's Degree, s/he cannot seek reentry into the programme in the fourth year; instead/they will need to take admission into the Master's programme in the first year.
- Students with a UG degree with Honours after 4 years will have to take admission into the second year of a 2-year Master's programme.
- Students with a UG degree with Honours and Research after 4 years can directly progress to a PhD programme, provided they secure a minimum of 75% marks.

Option for Online Courses

To achieve the three cardinal principles of India's Education Policy: Access, Equity, and Quality and for the benefit of students, options will be given for students to earn credit by completing quality-assured online programmes offered on the Study Webs of Active Learning for Young Aspiring Minds (SWAYAM: SWAYAM: www.swayam.gov.in) or other

online educational platforms approved by HPU as per the existing UGC regulations. Students may opt to earn credits from such courses up to 40 per cent of the total requirements, including I/A/P/C or work-based Vocational courses. (For details, see SPU SWAYAM Policy)

Programme Structure

Semester

A semester comprises 90 working days, and the academic calendar is divided into two semesters.

Credit Hours

The workload relating to a course is measured in terms of credit hours. A credit is a unit by which the coursework is measured. It determines the number of hours of instruction required per week over the duration of a semester (minimum of 15 weeks). Each course may have only a lecture component, a lecture and tutorial component, a lecture and practicum component, a lecture, tutorial, and practicum component or only a practicum component.

Credit Requirements

The minimum credit requirements of each category of courses for 3-Year Bachelor's Programmes are:

Level of Courses

Courses shall be coded based on the learning outcomes, level of difficulty, and academic rigour. The coding of courses will be as follows:

0-99: Pre-requisite courses required to undertake an introductory course, which will be a pass or fail course with no credits. It will replace the existing informal method of offering bridge courses, which are currently conducted in some colleges and universities.

100-199: Foundation or introductory courses that are intended for students to gain an understanding and basic knowledge about the subjects and help decide the subject or discipline of interest. These courses may also be prerequisites for courses in the major subjects.

200-299: Intermediate-level courses, including subject-specific courses, intended to meet the credit requirements for minor or major areas of learning. These courses can be part of a major and can be prerequisite courses for advanced-level major courses.

300-399: Higher-level courses which are required for majoring in a disciplinary/interdisciplinary area of study for the award of a degree.

400-499: Advanced courses which would include lecture courses with practical, seminar-based courses, term papers, research methodology, advanced laboratory experiments/software training, research projects, hands-on training, internship/apprenticeship projects at the undergraduate level or First Year Post-graduate theoretical and practical courses.

Attendance

A student shall be eligible to appear in the end-semester examination only if he/she has a minimum of 75% attendance. The terms and rules governing condoning can be found in the Examination Section of the Ordinance.

Examination and Grading

The examination and grading modalities of SPU-UGP will be in accordance with SPU's Examination and Grading Ordinance/Notifications.

Repeating or Options for Other Courses

- 1.If a student fails a particular course, he/she shall be promoted to the next semester/year as per guidelines for Examinations and Grading under NEP 2020.
- 2.Repetition of course (s) shall be only for the end-of-semester examinations.
- 3.In place of the failed courses, students may opt for the following in consultation with the parent department:
 - Choose online courses approved by SPU as per existing UGC regulations, having the same credits.

Promotion

Students shall be allowed to proceed from one semester/year to the next in accordance with SPU's Examination and Grading Ordinance/Notifications.

Eligibility for the UG Programmes (General Instruction under NEP)

- A student who has passed 12th standard or equivalent examination in any stream from a recognised institution (UGC-CCFUGP: 3.2.3).
- Admission to the 3-year/4-year UG programme will be based on the preference of the Major, if any. In case a student does not want to opt for any major in the 3-year programmes/they will be admitted based on their preferences for subject combinations.
- Admission to a discipline-specific course or major will be subject to the availability of the subject and the capacity of the college.
- No student shall be eligible for admission to a Programme in any discipline unless he/she fulfils the prerequisites of courses as fixed by the university.

First Semester

- A candidate should pass in the Senior Secondary (+2) Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by H.P. Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent there to by the various bodies of the University.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. Programme.
- A candidate passed 10+2 with one subject as mathematics or economic is also eligible to take admission in Commerce Stream.
- Provided that the candidates who have passed qualifying examination with arts stream/humanities shall be given preference in admission to BA programme.
- The Candidate in 1st Semester of UG Course will be admitted on the merit basis (percentage of marks/grade obtained in 10+2 examination).
- The student with compartment case is not eligible for admission.

Second Year / Third Year

A candidate must have appeared/passed in the Previous Year University Examinations.

Other Conditions are as per University Norms.

Age Limit

Maximum age limit for admission to B.A./B. Com courses is 23 for male candidates who belong to the general category and 25 years for girls as on 1st July 2026. A relaxation of 3 years is applicable to candidates belonging to SC/ ST category. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation up to maximum of 6 months.

Reservation:

The statutory reservation policy of the Government of Himachal Pradesh shall be followed in the selection of eligible candidates for admission.

Academic Bank of Credits (ABC)

The SPU-UGP is directly connected to the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earns at the end of an examination in SPU-UGP will be deposited in the ABC by the university.

As such, a student under SPU-UGP must register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies.

Admission Process

1. The candidate seeking admission in the college has to apply online at gcpanarsa.edu.in
2. The students can approach the College Guidance and Counselling Committee in case they find any difficulty in filling up of the admission form during the college hours.
3. The fresh applicant needs to register on the online admission portal and once registered, will use the created **User Id** and **Password** to fill up the application. Then the student will have to pay the prospectus fee and fill whole application form.
4. Once submitted, the application will be verified by the admission committee.
5. The merit lists will be displayed as per schedule mentioned in the prospectus.
6. Applicants seeking admission in first Semester/Year are required to present themselves against the counselling committee as per the scheduled in the merit list.
7. After the approval of counselling applicants are advised to deposit their fee online by using UPIs (BHIM/Google Pay/ Phone Pay/ Paytm)/Mobile/Internet Banking/Debit Card.

Note: 1. Only online mode of application and fee submission is accepted.

2. The students of BA/B.Com 2nd and 3rd Year must login to the admission portal with their last year's User Id and Password. They should not register again or create a New Id and Password.

Documents Required to be Uploaded with the Form:

- Matriculation certificate for Date of Birth.
- 10+2 marks sheet.
- H.P. Domicile certificate for girl students (for exemption in tuition fee).
- Minimum 40% disability certificate, sports/cultural quota and category certificate in case of students seeking admission against these seats.
- Original character certificate from Head of the Institution last attended. In case of private candidates, the character certificate must have been issued by a Gazetted officer/ Panchayat Pradhan/ Ward Counsellor but not older than 6 months from the day of submission of admission form.
- For seat against the 'single girl child category' an Affidavit proclaiming the same from the parents is to be submitted with the admission form.
- A student seeking admission from Board/University other than H.P. will have to upload the copy of migration certificate and the original certificate has to be submitted at the time of counselling.
- Certificate of SC/ ST (if applicable) from Magistrate Class-1 (Authorized Signatory)
- Any gap (latest) in the academic career of the applicant must be supported by a documentary evidence/ affidavit as proof of his/ her activities during the period of gap.

Students Course wise Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Evaluation

All courses involve an evaluation system of students that has the following components:

1. **Term End Examination:** It is of three-hour duration covering whole syllabus of the course and counts for 70% in theory for Arts and Commerce where practical is not involved. For the subjects/courses where practical is involved it is 50% in theory, 20% in practical and 30% in CCA/IA.
2. **Continuous Comprehensive assessment (CCA):** For determining CCA following procedure is applicable:
 - 5 marks for attendance.
 - 15 marks for house test/mid term to be taken on completion of 50% for semester system and 75% for annual system of syllabus.
 - 10 marks for assignments, tutorials, general behaviour of student
 - Total marks of CCA: 30

Classroom Attendance: Each student will have to attend a minimum of 75% Lectures/ Tutorials/ Practical's. A student having less than 75% attendance will not be allowed to appear in the Term End Examination.

- Provided that those having between 74% and 65% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by clear reason(s) for absence to the authorized functionaries.
- Provided that those having between 64% and 50% attendance will apply for exemption in a prescribed form accompanied by a Medical Certificate from a Government Hospital.
- Provided that exemption from 75% attendance will be given to those participating in prescribed co-curricular activities (e.g., NCC, NSS, Youth Festivals, Sports etc.) to the extent of 25% (making the necessary attendance as 50% in these cases). However, the claim for this exemption should be supported by authenticated certificate from the concerned college authorities.
- Provided further that those getting the exemptions, except for those getting exemptions for co- curricular activities will not be entitled for getting the CCA marks for classroom attendance as given below.

Classroom Attendance Incentive:

Those having greater than 75% attendance (for those participating in Co-curricular activities, 25% will be added to percent attendance) will be awarded CCA marks as follows:

>75% but < 80% 1 marks

> 80% but < 85% 2 marks

> 85% but < 90% 3 marks

>90% but < 95% 4 marks > 95% 5 marks

The registration for the Term End Examination will be done at the time of the enrolment for the course. The fee for the Term End Examination will also be collected at that time as decided by the university from time to time.

Leave Rules and Fine

- A student can proceed on leave with prior permission of the Principal but the application should also be signed by the parents of the student and duly recommended by the tutor.
- A tutor can recommend leave up to maximum of five days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the Principal.
- Leave on account of illness if it is for more than three days must be accompanied by Medical Certificate.
- Student's participation in various inter college games or other competitions including youth festival, tour etc. will have to get their leave sanctioned by the Principal with prior recommendation of their incharges concerned before their departure.
- The name of a student will be struck off from the college roll in case he/she does not attend continuous classes for workshop days.
- The students can seek re-admission twice during the session. First re-admission will be allowed within three days after the name is struck off after paying a fine of 100/- and a fine of 200/- will be charged for the second re-admission within 10 days after the name is struck off from the rolls.

Identity Card:

- Identity card is the most important document of the college student, because it is the only identification for anyone to establish that one is a student of the college.
- Any transaction between students and college is entertained only after production of Identity card. If a student has to deal with any kind of work related to examination, library, collection/inspection of documents, and one has to produce one's Identity card in order to establish one's identity.
- Students are not permitted to replace the photograph pasted on the Identity card for any reason whatsoever.
- If Identity card is lost, one has to file an F.I.R. in order to get a duplicate Identity card issued.

- In event of inspection of Identity card during surprise check or for any other reason, if the student is unable to produce the Identity card he/she will be handed over to the police or as the situation may demand. Students without Identity card are deemed as outsiders.
- In case, the Identity card gets misplaced, misused by anti-social elements the student concerned shall be held responsible for his/her deeds. It is the personal responsibility of the student to keep his/her identity card in safe custody.
- All the students are directed to collect their identity cards and complete the formalities related to their identity cards within one week of admission.

Facilities and Co-curricular Activities in the College:

CSCA:

The CSCA (College Students Central Association) is formed by the College every year according to Sardar Patel University, Mandi (H.P.) guidelines on the basis of merit based nomination.

OSA (Old Student Association or Alumni Association)

An Old Students' Association or Alumni Association is formed in our college with effect from session 2024-25. This association will serve as a platform to connect with former students and engage new students in the college's development. By harnessing the experiences of old students and the energy of new students, the association can contribute towards the overall growth of the college. It's an initiative to foster a strong alumni network and promote collaboration between past and current students.

Clubs and Societies:

The college has various clubs and societies to inculcate community participation among the students. The students can join one of the following clubs/societies according to his/her interest in the field of choice:

NSS (National Service Scheme):

NSS is a very important part of the activities of any educational institute. It helps in developing the spirit of service for the community. The College has a full unit of around 100 NSS volunteers who engage in campus beautification, cleanliness and other services for the community. Various awareness drives are undertaken by the NSS unit.

Rovers & Rangers:

The College has recently established a well organized units of Rovers & Rangers.

Sports:

The College provides facilities to sportsmen who wish to make a mark in games. The discipline in which the college plans to prepare teams for University Championships are:

Athletics and Volley-Ball. The college provides various incentives for the students participating in competitions held at University/State/Zonal/National Level. A committee of teachers will decide the formation of teams to represent the college in different tournaments.

The college also provides guidance to students for participation in various competitions. These items are Music (Vocal), Debates, Declamation, Quiz, Poetic Symposium, Painting, Dance, Poster Making and Rangoli etc.

Career Guidance and Placement Cell:

This cell helps students by providing guidance about career options and information about job placements through various Govt. and private agencies. It arranges lectures by experts and concerned officials for selection of better & suitable career options.

Annual Prize Distribution Function:

Annual prize distribution function is an occasion to award students who excel in the fields of Academics, Sports, cultural, NSS and other activities. The rules for the prizes will be notified one month prior to the celebration.

PTA (Parent-Teachers Association):

There is a Parent-Teachers Association in the college with the objective to have participation of parents for development of the institution. The executive committee of PTA is elected during the month of August every year. There is a General Body of PTA comprising:

- Parents or guardians
- Colleges Teachers
- The principal of the college as the patron

College Magazine: The College publishes its magazine “Arjikiya” annually which provides a forum to the students with a flair for writing.

Educational/Study Tours:

Educational/Study tours are organized so that the students do not remain confined to their curriculum and can extend outside the boundaries of the classroom and academics. The NSS volunteers who are regular in their attendance and have good conduct will be eligible for the tour. Students will have to produce a written permission from their parents for joining such tours. No tour can be organized without accompanying of any teacher and prior permission of the college administration.

College Library

The college library is having about 1500 books in various subjects, magazines, and newspapers. Recently our college has registered in NDLI (National Digital Library of India). National Digital Library of India (NDLI) is a virtual repository of learning resources which is not just a repository with search/browse facilities but provides a host of services containing textbooks, articles, videos, audio books, lectures, simulations, fiction and all other kinds of learning media for the learners/user’s community. Students can approach this facility with the help of library staff.

All the students are required to adhere to the following Library rules strictly:

- All the students on the rolls of the College shall be eligible to become members of the College library.
- Every student is entitled to borrow two books for a period of 15 days from the library.
- The borrower shall be solely responsible for the safety/preservation of the books drawn by him/her.
- A fine of Rs. 1/- per day per book will be charged beyond due date of, return of the book.
- In case a book is found mutilated, torn, defaced or misplaced, the actual cost of the book plus 20% of the original cost will be charged from the student.

- Reference books are to be consulted in the library itself after obtaining permission from the Librarian.
- The College also operates a book bank from which text books are loaned to poor students of all categories on payment of a nominal security, (i.e., actual cost plus 20% and maintenance charge of Rs. 2/- per book).

Note: Students can get their library security refunded within one year after leaving the College; otherwise, the security stands forfeited.

Scholarships:

ABSTRACT OF UGC REGULATIONS ON RAGGING

SUMMARY OF UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009.

1. PREAMBLE: In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 8.05.2009 and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging.

2. OBJECTIVE: To eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities, deemed universities and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these Regulations, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided for in these Regulations and the appropriate law in force.

3. WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING: more of any of the following acts: Ragging constitutes one or

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student.
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING

The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:

- The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
 1. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 2. Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
 3. Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
 4. Withholding results.
 5. Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 6. Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
 7. Cancellation of admission.
 8. Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
 9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.
- An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie, (i) in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (ii) in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor. (iii) in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.
- Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faculty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faculty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.
