The timetable is prepared in accordance with the courses being taught in the college distributing the subject classes and the tutorial classes in a manner to ensure effective teaching. The class teacher discusses all the objectives of the curriculum, course outcomes, and program outcomes with students at the beginning of the session as well as during the special mentoring sessions. The teaching-learning programs are restricted not only to the classrooms but include a number of enrichment activities. Teaching-learning is student-centric, highly interactive, and innovative; blending a variety of methods including ICT, where suitable. The institution has installed 2 e-classrooms with ICT-enabled facilities to enhance the teaching learning process. The department of higher education provided an interactive panel to strengthen the career-counseling activities. The teachers also use Whatsapp groups as effective tools to share e-content of the study material. The college building has its own fully functional Wi-Fi internet facility.</p> <p>The teaching is also conducted as per the need of different groups of students through group discussions.</p> <p>Tutorials and continuous assessments are used to identify student learning difficulties and special needs. Assignments and project presentations are integrated to judge students' course-specific achievements. Regular class tests and mid-term examinations also help to identify the program specific and course-specific outcomes. The performance at each task is discussed and internal assessment scores are scrutinized at the department level before being intimated to the students. Flipped Classroom for B.Com IIIrd



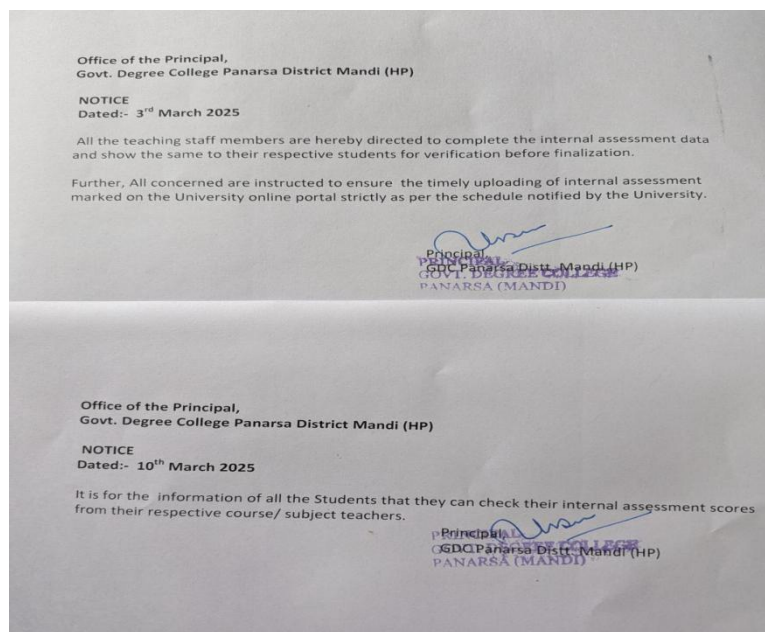


